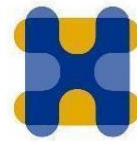

Forum Concept: Contemporary climate planning and policy is failing to keep the promise of 1.5° alive and to deliver fit-for-purpose adaptation, even while it continues to overlook the historic and cultural origins of anthropogenic climate change and the socio-cultural enabling conditions of transformative climate action. Increasingly, we see that these two things are connected. This Forum explores the consequences of climate action without culture in Europe and beyond; it lays out pathways to fill this gap by holistically integrating culture and heritage into climate action at European and global levels; and it explores ways to support the work of cultural heritage advocates to put culture at the heart of green transformation.

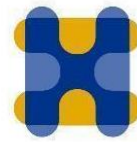

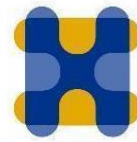
