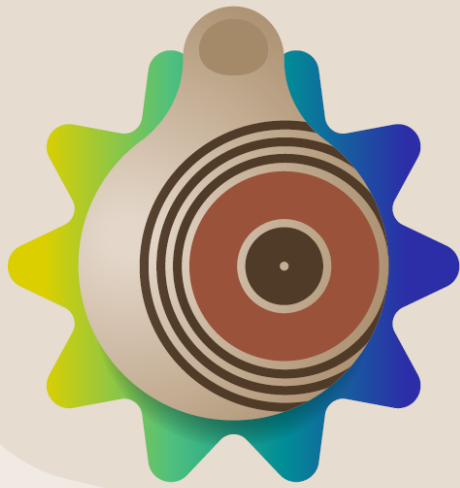

European Cultural Heritage Summit 2026

Nicosia, Cyprus

Europa Nostra and the Europa Nostra Heritage Hub in Nicosia are hosting the [European Cultural Heritage Summit 2026](#) from 26 to 30 May in Nicosia, Cyprus, under the motto “Heritage as the Soul of Mare Nostrum”. The Summit is held under the patronage of the Cyprus Presidency of the Council of the EU, and is supported by the European Union.

Holding our Summit in Cyprus at this point of time is particularly meaningful. Situated at the crossroads of Europe and the Middle East, Cyprus experiences both the complexities and the opportunities of the shared heritage of the Mediterranean – Mare Nostrum. The island’s experience both with division and with a challenging path towards reconciliation, offers a fitting environment for discussions on heritage as a peace-building instrument.

From the [In Varietate Concordia Talk](#) – during which we shall reflect on the shared heritage that has shaped the civilisations of the Mare Nostrum across millennia and today serves as a vital bridge for dialogue and collaboration – to the [European Heritage Awards Ceremony](#) – during which we shall celebrate the extraordinary achievements of the [winners of the European Heritage Awards / Europa Nostra Awards 2026](#) – the Nicosia Summit will highlight the (geo)political, societal, economic and environmental relevance of cultural heritage for Europe and the wider Mediterranean region.

The [European Heritage Policy Agora](#) will explore how cultural heritage can drive sustainable development across the Mediterranean. It will show how initiatives linking cultural and natural heritage strengthen climate action, boost the resilience of the heritage ecosystem and promote inclusive communities.

The [European Heritage Hub Forum](#) will focus on cultural heritage as a powerful vector of peace across the Mediterranean, with special emphasis on the Middle East. It will highlight existing projects of Europe-Middle East cooperation, demonstrating how sustained collaboration between European civil society organisations and local partners from the Middle East can strengthen community resilience and foster peaceful engagement and advocating the need to further enhance the cultural dimension of the EU’s New Pact for the Mediterranean.

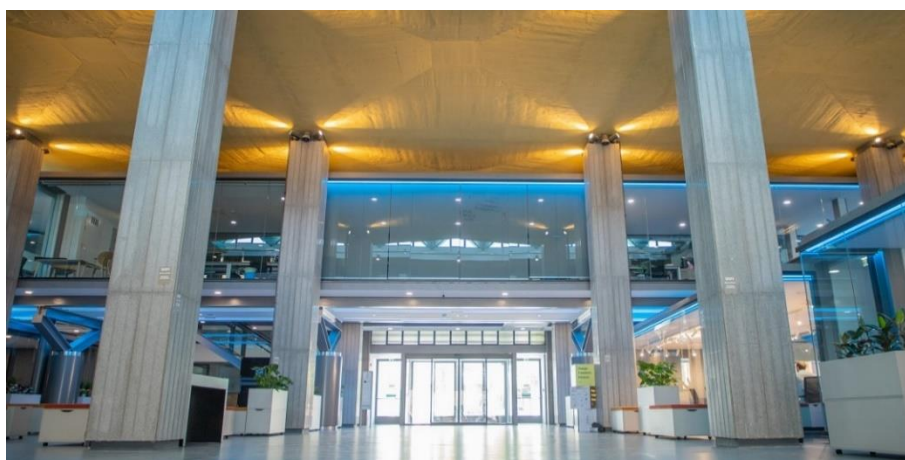

In the framework of the EU-funded [European Heritage Hub](#), the Europa Nostra Heritage Hub in Nicosia will present the [exhibition “Modern Nicosia”](#) during the European Cultural Heritage Summit 2026. The exhibition will be officially inaugurated on the afternoon of 29 May in the presence of Charalambos Prountzos and Mehmet Harmanci, Leaders of the Greek Cypriot and Turkish Cypriot communities of the city of Nicosia, shortly before [European Heritage Hub Forum “Mare Nostrum: Fostering Peace through Heritage”](#). The exhibition will be displayed at the Mayor Lellos Demetriades Square in front of CYENS - Centre of Excellence.

“Modern Nicosia” seeks to highlight the legacy of modern architecture on both sides of the divided capital of Cyprus as a shared component of cultural heritage. The exhibition presents 40 selected buildings from across the city — 20 located within and 20 beyond the historic city walls — illustrating how different phases of modern architecture have shaped Nicosia’s urban landscape.

Through this selection, the exhibition showcases local and distinctive interpretations of modern architecture, while revealing the social, cultural, economic, and political narratives embedded within buildings of diverse functions. It also draws attention to the continuity established by modernist architecture across the city, emphasising its contribution to Nicosia’s long-established urban identity.

By raising awareness of this significant yet often overlooked legacy, the exhibition aims to counteract neglect and the gradual decay of modern buildings. In doing so, it aspires to inform and inspire future policies that will support the preservation and protection of Nicosia’s shared architectural heritage.

Registration and Access Badge

You can pick up your badge at the venues prior to the events and at the Registration Desk (located at Kamara Hall - Aristokyprou 41, Nicosia 1015) on Tuesday 26 May (15:00-18:30) and Wednesday 27 May (08:00-09:00).

Delegates who registered after 20 May, will need to get their access badge printed on-site.

We kindly ask you to wear your access badge at all events.

You do not need to wear the badge during the Awards Ceremony. All registered participants will receive a digital entrance ticket for the Awards Ceremony.

Getting to Nicosia

The main international gateway is Larnaca International Airport (approx. 50 km from Nicosia). Transfer time is around 40-50 minutes.

Airport shuttle buses, taxis and private transfers are available.

An alternative airport is Paphos International Airport (approx. 1.5 hours from Nicosia).

Entry, Travel Documents & Travel Advice

Cyprus is a Member State of the European Union but is not part of the Schengen Area. Passport or ID checks may take place upon arrival. EU citizens: National ID card or passport required. Non-EU citizens: Valid passport (and visa if applicable). Identification is required at designated crossing points within the city. For more information, please read [here](#) and check regularly your country's official government [travel advice](#).

Payments

Currency: Euro (€). Credit and debit cards are widely accepted.





Weather & Climate

Mediterranean climate with expected temperatures of approximately 25-32°C. Strong sunshine and warm conditions, occasionally humid.

Light clothing, comfortable walking shoes, sunglasses and sun protection (SPF 30+) are strongly recommended.

Mobile Network Selection in Cyprus

Please make sure to switch off data roaming when walking close to the border areas.

As a member of the European Union, Cyprus is covered by EU mobile roaming regulations (please check your specific provider's roaming policy).

Upon arrival, your phone will automatically search for a network. While this is usually seamless when you land in Larnaca or Paphos, you must be cautious when traveling near the Buffer Zone (for example, inside the Old City, but not only). In these areas, your phone may automatically connect to north mobile towers because their signals are often strong. This can result in significant unintended roaming charges.

To avoid this, go to your phone's Settings and switch from "Automatic" to "Manual" network selection. Ensure you stay connected to a southern provider.

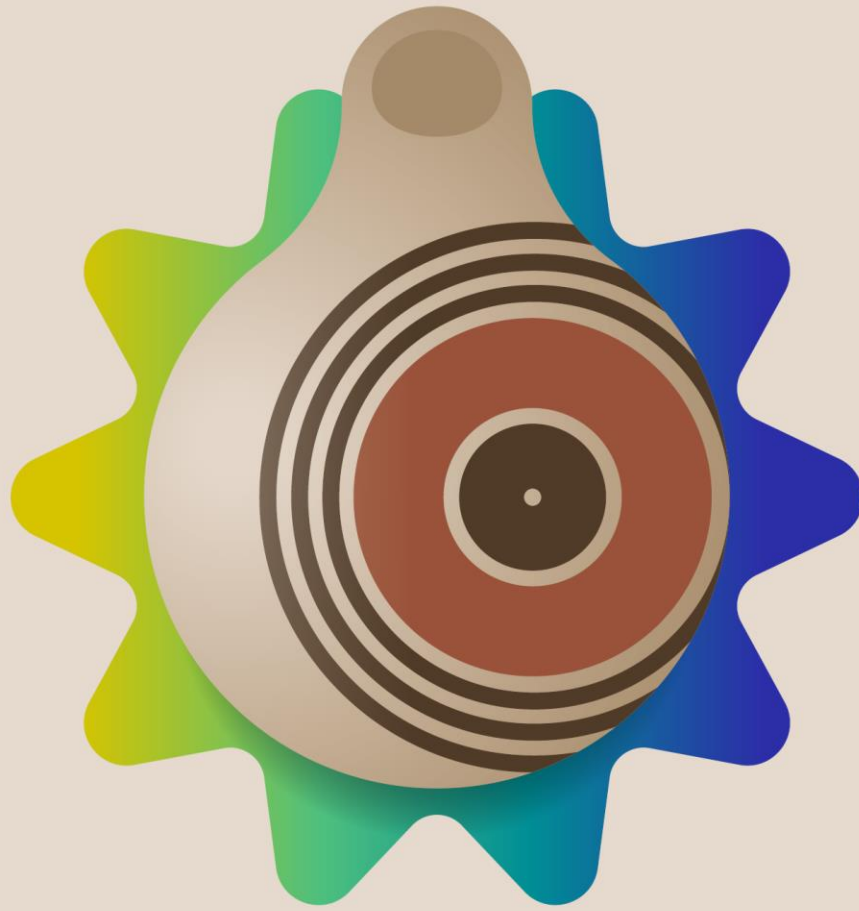
